Running annually since the 1920s, recent exhibits have included:



- Leaf insects (left), harvest mice and meat-eating cockroaches (not all together!)
 - A wasps' nest, cacti, carnivorous plants, caterpillars and exotic edible fungi
 - Live feeds from swift nest boxes, and cricket sonograms
 - Geology of the Fen Edge, with specimens
 - Wildlife of the city
- ... and there are lots of experts keen to help explain and identify specimens brought in.

All are welcome to exhibit, from world experts on fascinating aspects of nature to amateur sleuths exploring their own parks, gardens and even houses.
